## **Thursday 1 June      *St Justin 100 AD – 165 AD***

*Saint Justin, also known as Justin Martyr was an early Christian apologist, and is regarded as the foremost interpreter of the theory of the Logos in the 2nd century. He was martyred, alongside some of his students. Most of his works are lost, but two apologies and a dialogue did survive.*

<i>Anglican Communion</i>	Province of The Episcopal Church – Assistant Bishop of North Carolina, The Rt Revd William Gregg; and the Diocese of North Carolina - The Revd Samuel Rodman, clergy and people. <i>Anglicanism was brought to the New World by explorers and colonists with the first celebration of the Holy Eucharist in Jamestown, Virginia, in 1607. There was no resident Bishop for nearly two hundred years, causing problems when many of the clergy sided with the Crown during the American Revolution. In 1784, the Scottish Episcopal Church consecrated the first American Bishop. The Church has 9 Provinces, 98 Dioceses, plus 20 overseas jurisdictions. Out of a population of 284 million, only 2 million are Episcopalians, in 7,095 parishes, with 15,310 clergy.</i>

## **Friday 2 June**

<i>Anglican Communion</i>	Diocese of North Central Philippines - Province of Philippines, The Rt Revd Joel Atiwag Pachao, clergy and people. <i>With its history as a Spanish colony, the Philippines were predominantly Roman Catholic. When Americans colonized the country in 1898, Anglican missionary work began in the north and among Muslim populations in the south. Four dioceses were established by 1971. The Church consecrated its first Bishop in 1963 and became an autonomous Province in 1990. Inaugurated on 1 May 1990 there are 6 dioceses, 1,042 parishes and 252 clergy. The population of the Philippines is 77 million; Christians form 92%.</i>

**Monday 5 June      *St Boniface 675 AD – 745 AD – Thy Kingdom Week of Prayer***

*Saint Boniface, born in the kingdom of Wessex in Anglo-Saxon England, was a leading figure in the Anglo-Saxon mission to the Germanic parts of the Frankish Empire during the 8th century. He established the first organized Christianity in many parts of Germania. He is the patron saint of Germania, the first archbishop of Mainz and the "Apostle of the Germans". He was killed in Frisia in 754, along with 52 others. His remains were returned to Fulda, where they rest in a sarcophagus which became a site of pilgrimage.*

*The West Indies became a self-governing Province of the worldwide Anglican Communion in 1883 because of the Church of England missions in territories that became British colonies. It is made up of*

*two mainland dioceses and six island dioceses, including Barbados, Belize, Guyana, Jamaica, Nassau and the Bahamas, Tobago, Trinidad, and the Windward Islands. Great emphasis is being placed on training personnel for an indigenous ministry. The island locations and scattered settlements make pastoral care difficult and costly.*

## Thursday 8 June **Bishop Thomas Ken, 1637-1711 – Thy Kingdom Week of Prayer**

*Thomas Ken was an English cleric who was considered the most eminent of the English non-juring bishops, and one of the fathers of modern English hymnody. Ken was born in 1637 at Little Berkhamstead, Hertfordshire. His father was Thomas Ken of Furnival's Inn, of the Ken family of Ken Place, in Somerset; his mother was the daughter of little known English poet, John Chalkhill. In 1646 Ken's stepsister, Anne, married Izaak Walton, author of The Compleat Angler, a connection which brought Ken under the influence of this gentle and devout man.*

**Friday 9 June      *St Columba, abbot, missionary, c.521-597 – Thy Kingdom Week of Prayer***

*Columba studied in monastic schools and received bardic training in Irish poetry and literature. When he became a priest his family (Irish royal houses) gave him a fort (later Londonderry) where he established his first monastery. For fifteen years preached and founded monasteries in Ireland. After a tribal war had to leave Ireland, in a coracle and arrived at Iona. Evangelised the Picts with missions to Inverness, Ardnamurchan, Skye, Kintyre, Loch Ness and Lochaber.*

Diocese of North West Australia – Province of Western Australia, Australia, The Revd Gary Nelson, clergy and people. *The Province of the Anglican Church of Australia. The Church came to Australia in 1788 with the First Fleet, which was made up primarily of convicts and military personnel. Free settlers soon followed. A General Synod held in 1872 formed the Australian Board of Missions; missionary work among the aborigines and the Torres Strait Islanders was key to the growth of the Church. The Anglican Church of Australia is part of the Christian Conference of Asia and of the Council of the Church of East Asia. Links with Churches of New Guinea, Melanesia and Polynesia are strong especially through the Australian Board of Mission. Population 18 million, Christians 12.5 million, Anglicans 4 million, Parishes 3,313, and clergy just over 2,000.*

Went with Paul to Antioch and later to Cyprus with John Mark. Disagreed with Paul about taking John Mark on another mission and Barnabas went with John Mark while Paul took Silas. May have been martyred in Salamis by stoning.*

It has rapidly increased the number of its dioceses and bishops from 91 to 122. There are 3,680 Anglican congregations and 4,000 clergy. The administrative headquarters are in Abuja*

*The Feast of Corpus Christi (Latin for Body of Christ) is a Latin Rite liturgical solemnity celebrating the reality of the Body and blood of Jesus Christ Son of God in the Eucharist. It emphasizes the joy of the institution of the Eucharist.*

*The Province includes Botswana, Malawi, Zambia, and Zimbabwe. The first Anglican missionary to Malawi was Bishop Charles Mackenzie, who arrived with David Livingstone in 1861. The Province was inaugurated in 1955 and has a movable bishopric. The countries forming the Province are very different. Zambia and Botswana suffer the difficulties of rapid industrialization, along with underdeveloped, thinly populated areas. In Malawi, 30 per cent of the adult males are away as migrant labourers in other countries at any given time. Zimbabwe is experiencing problems of social adjustment after independence. The Province has 15 Dioceses for a population of nearly 32 million. There are 15 million Christians of which Anglicans number 600,000. There are 250 parishes, and 400 clergy.*

*Saint Alban is venerated as the first recorded British Christian martyr, and is one of four named martyrs recorded from Roman Britain. He is traditionally believed to have been beheaded in the Roman city of Verulamium sometime during the 3rd or 4th century.*
