- Windermere Deanery* *Before 1990 the northern two thirds of Nigeria was largely blocked, but eight new bishops were consecrated, paid for by Lagos parishes, and the Project has been highly successful. It is the second largest province in the Anglican Communion, as measured by baptized membership, after the Church of England. Current membership over 25 million, out of a total Nigerian population of 104 million. Since 2002 the Church of Nigeria is organised in 10 ecclesiastical provinces. It has rapidly increased the number of its dioceses and bishops from 91 to 122. There are 3,680 Anglican congregations and 4,000 clergy. The administrative headquarters are in Abuja*

Wednesday 2 November All Souls Day

- Anglican Communion* Indianapolis - (V, The Episcopal Church) The Rt Revd Catherine Waynick, clergy and people.
- Windermere Deanery* *Anglicanism was brought to the New World by explorers and colonists with the first celebration of the Holy Eucharist in Jamestown, Virginia, in 1607. There was no resident Bishop for nearly two hundred years, causing problems when many of the clergy sided with the Crown during the American Revolution. In 1784, the Scottish Episcopal Church consecrated the first American Bishop. The Church has 9 Provinces, 98 Dioceses, plus 20 overseas jurisdictions. Out of a population of 284 million, only 2 million are Episcopalians, in 7,095 parishes, with 15,310 clergy.*

Thursday 3 November *Richard Hooker, priest, teacher of the faith, 1553-1600*

Theologian, born in Exeter who held the influential position of Master of the Temple. Despairing of the religious controversies of his day, he returned to a country living near Salisbury and, later, to Bishopsbourne, near Canterbury, devoting his time to writing "Ecclesiastical Polity", an eight volume work remarkable for its moderation and defence of the Anglican Church. He did not accept the jurisdiction of the Pope and insisted that the C of E was in continuity with the historical church and defended the doctrine of the apostolic succession and the institution of episcopacy. Yet it was well received in the Vatican.

Anglican Communion Iran - (Jerusalem & Middle East) The Rt Revd Azad Marshall, clergy and people.

The Church covers the four dioceses of Jerusalem, Iran, Egypt, Cyprus and the Gulf. The Jerusalem bishopric was founded in 1841 and became an archbishopric in 1957. Reorganization in January 1976 ended the archbishopric and combined the Diocese of Jordan, Lebanon, and Syria with the Jerusalem bishopric after a nineteen-year separation. Around the same time, the new Diocese of Cyprus and the Gulf was formed and the Diocese of Egypt was revived. The Cathedral Church of St George the Martyr in Jerusalem is known for its ministry to pilgrims. St George's College, Jerusalem, is in partnership with the Anglican Communion. .

Anglican Communion The Lusitanian Church (E-P to the Archbishop of Canterbury), Lusitanian Church - (Portugal) The Rt Revd José Jorge De Pina Cabral, clergy and people.
The American Episcopal Church organized the Lusitanian Church, Catholic Apostolic Evangelical in 1880. The Church consisted of Roman Catholic Priests who formed congregations in and around Lisbon using a translation of the 1662 English Prayer Book. A Lusitanian Bishop was consecrated in 1958 and in the early 1960s many Provinces of the Anglican Communion established full Communion with the Church in Portugal. Full integration occurred in 1980 when the Church became an extra provincial diocese under the metro political authority of the Archbishop of Canterbury.

Monday 7 November *St Willibrord, bishop, 658-739*

Willibrord is the patron of the Netherlands. A Yorkshireman, he studied under Wilfrid at Ripon and was determined to follow Wilfrid in evangelising the Friesians. He was given a mission by the Pope and eventually consecrated as archbishop of the Friesians. He built churches and monasteries and consecrated bishops. His most famous monastery was at Echternach, now Luxembourg, which, after his death at the age of 81, became a centre for pilgrimage.

The Province of North India was inaugurated in 1970 after many years

of preparation. It includes the Anglican Church, the United Church of Northern India (Congregationalist and Presbyterian). The Methodist Church (British and Australian Conferences), the Council of Baptist Churches in Northern India, the Church of the Brethren in India, and the Disciples of Christ. Along with the Church of South India, the Church of Pakistan, and the Church of Bangladesh, it is one of the four United Churches. The population is 500,000,000, with 27 Dioceses.

The Church was inaugurated in 1947 by the union of the South India United Church (itself a union of Congregational and Presbyterian/Reformed traditions), the southern Anglican diocese of the Church of India, Burma, Ceylon, and the Methodist Church in South India. It is one of the four United Churches in the Anglican Communion. There are 22 Dioceses.

Martin was an army officer and member of the Imperial Guard. When meeting a beggar in Amiens, he cut his cloak in two to give the beggar half. Martin became a disciple of Bishop Hilary of Poitiers and, for some years, lived as a hermit. Others came to join him and he established a monastery, perhaps the first in France. After Hilary's death Martin became

bishop of Tours and founded a number of monasteries. His shrine at Tours was one of the most popular, being en route from Canterbury to Santiago de Compostela.

Great emphasis is being placed on training personnel for an indigenous ministry. The island locations and scattered settlements make pastoral care difficult and costly.

The Reformed Episcopal Church of Spain - (Spain) The Rt Revd Carlos López-Lozano, clergy and people.

Under the leadership of a former Roman Catholic Priest, the Spanish Reformed Church was under the pastoral care of the Bishop of Mexico

starting in 1880. In 1894, the Bishop of Meath consecrated the first Bishop and the Church of Ireland accepted metropolitan authority. The Church was fully integrated in 1980 as an extra-provincial diocese under the metro political authority of the Archbishop of Canterbury.

The Province is the oldest in Africa. British Anglicans met for worship in Cape Town after 1806, with the first Bishop appointed in 1847. The 23 dioceses of the Province extend beyond the Republic of South Africa and include the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (St Helena and Tristan da Cunha), Mozambique (Lebombo and Niassa), the Republic of Namibia, the Kingdom of Lesotho, the Kingdom of Swaziland and Angola. Total population 80,700,000. 28.5 million Christians. 3 million Anglicans with 28 Dioceses, 1,240 clergy, 994 parishes and 1,900 congregations.

Wednesday 16 November *Margaret, queen, philanthropist, 1046-1093*

Queen Margaret and her sister were exiled from England by Canute and, after a time at the court of Edward the Confessor, by William the Conqueror also. They were captured by Malcolm III of Scotland and he married Margaret. She had a remarkable effect on him and his court. Drunkenness and debauchery were curbed or stopped. Court ladies were treated with respect. Malcolm was devoted to her and she taught him to pray. Poor people were brought into the palace daily and fed by Margaret and Malcolm. Many Norman prisoners who had been captured by the Scots were ransomed and sent back to England. She founded an abbey in Dunfermline and persuaded Malcolm to rebuild the monastery at Iona. Three of her sons became Kings of Scotland and a daughter married Henry I of England.

Thursday 17 November *St Hugh, bishop, 1140-1200*

Born in France, became a monk at La Grande Chartreuse, renowned for its austerity and silence. After ten years, sent to England to establish the first Carthusian house in Somerset. Henry II respected Hugh's spirituality and wisdom and nominated him as bishop of Lincoln. Hugh found the Diocese in poor state; there had been no bishop for 18 years, the King had appropriated the income, morale was low and the cathedral had been devastated by an earthquake. Hugh rebuilt the cathedral and made Lincoln a centre of learning. He became champion of the oppressed, provided settlements for lepers and defended Jewish communities. He advised three difficult monarchs, Henry II, Richard I and John. After making a pilgrimage to Thomas Becket's shrine he died in London.

Friday 18 November *St Elizabeth of Hungary*

Elizabeth was born in Hungary in 1207, the daughter of Alexander II, King of Hungary. In 1221 she married Louis of Thuringia and in spite of her position at court began to lead an austere simple life, practiced penance, and devoted herself to works of charity. Her husband encouraged her virtue and they had three children. Louis was killed and after his death Elizabeth left the court and made arrangements for the care of her children and in 1228 renounced the world becoming a tertiary of St Francis. She built the Franciscan hospital at Marburg and devoted herself to the care of the sick until her death at the age of 24 in 1231.

Saturday 19 November *Hilda, abbess of Whitby, 614-680*

Hilda was baptised, with King Edwin of Northumbria's household in 627. She was persuaded to remain in England and not go to a monastery in France by Aidan of Lindisfarne. She became abbess of the double monastery at Whitby where she was the superior of monks and nuns and responsible for a large estate which included Caedmon, the herdsman-poet. Five of her monks became bishops. Her energy and wisdom were highly regarded. The great synod of Whitby, which debated whether the English church should follow the Celtic or the Latin Rite, met at her monastery in 664. The abbey and library at Whitby were destroyed by Danish invasions in the tenth century.

Tuesday 22 November *St Cecilia, martyr, c.230*

The legend is that she was an early Christian martyr who was married against her will, refused to consummate the marriage and converted her husband. They both refused to sacrifice to the Roman Gods and were martyred. But none of the 4th century writers on virgin saints mention her. Cecilia's status as the patron saint of music dates from a 5th century biography which describes how she sang to the Lord, consecrating herself to virginity, as the organ played at her wedding.

The Universities Mission to Central Africa and the Church Missionary Society began work in 1864 and 1878 at Mpwapwa. The Province was inaugurated in 1970

following the division of the Province of East Africa into the Province of Kenya and the Province of Tanzania. The 19 dioceses represent both evangelical and Anglo-Catholic Churches. There are 16 bishops and 685 priests. The population is 30 million of which 45% are Christians and 35% Muslims. Only about 2 million are Anglicans.

Wednesday 23 November *Clement, bishop, martyr, c.100*

Clement was probably fourth in line of the bishops of Rome following Peter, Linus, and Cletus. He is thought to have assumed office in AD91 and was certainly alive at the time of the martyrdom of both Peter and Paul. He wrote a letter to the Corinthians about 95-98 which scholars regard as genuine. He is thought to have been martyred under the Emperor Trajan; being deported to the Crimea and thrown into the sea with an anchor tied round his neck - hence the symbol. Church dedications to St Clement are common all over Europe including St Clement Dane's in London.

There are now 29 Dioceses for 6,700,000 Anglicans, with 28 bishops, 13,800 congregations, 1,731 parishes, 2,630 priests and 13,000 Readers and catechists.

Wednesday 30 November St Andrew the Apostle

According to John 1.40 Andrew was a disciple of John the Baptist and went to tell his brother Simon "We have found the Messiah". He brought Simon to Jesus. He is repeatedly mentioned in the Gospels, particularly in relation to the Feeding of the Multitude (John 6.8-10). Many apocryphal stories developed about Andrew. Jerome says he was martyred in Greece; other accounts say he went to Syria or Ethiopia. He became a patron saint of Russia and the chief patron saint of Scotland. The saltire, or diagonal cross of St Andrew, now part of the Union Flag, was not known until the 10th century.
